



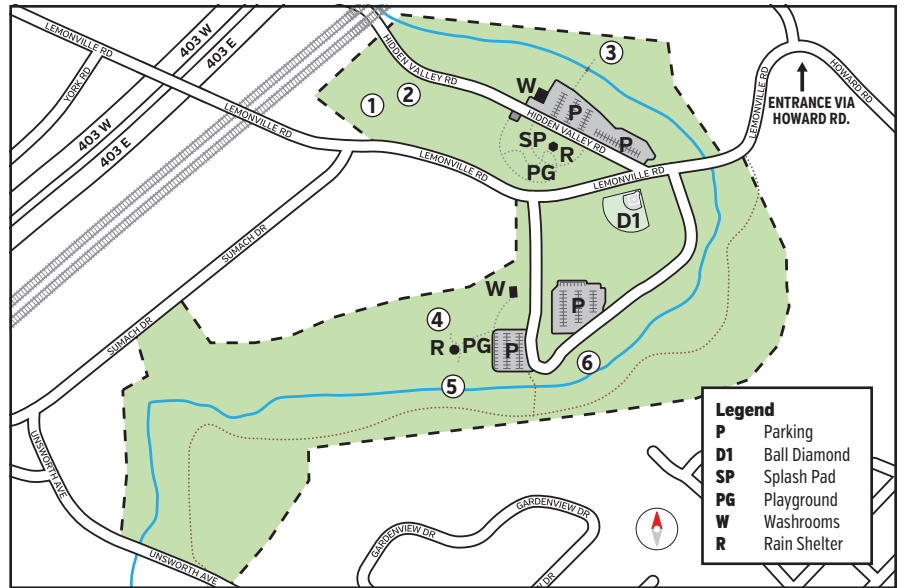
## Hidden Valley Park

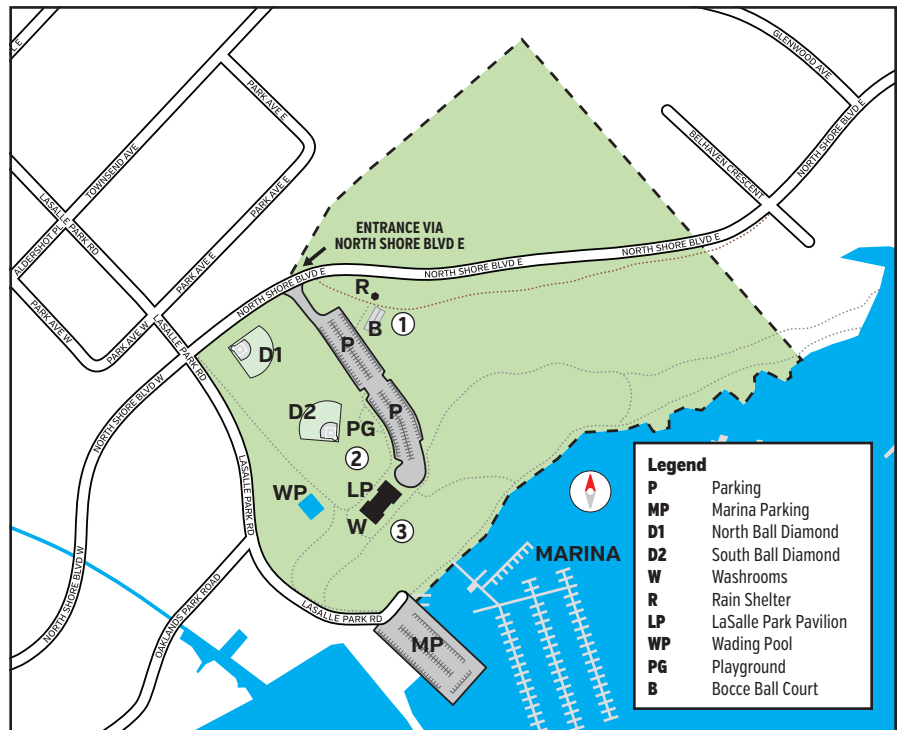




## Lowville Park

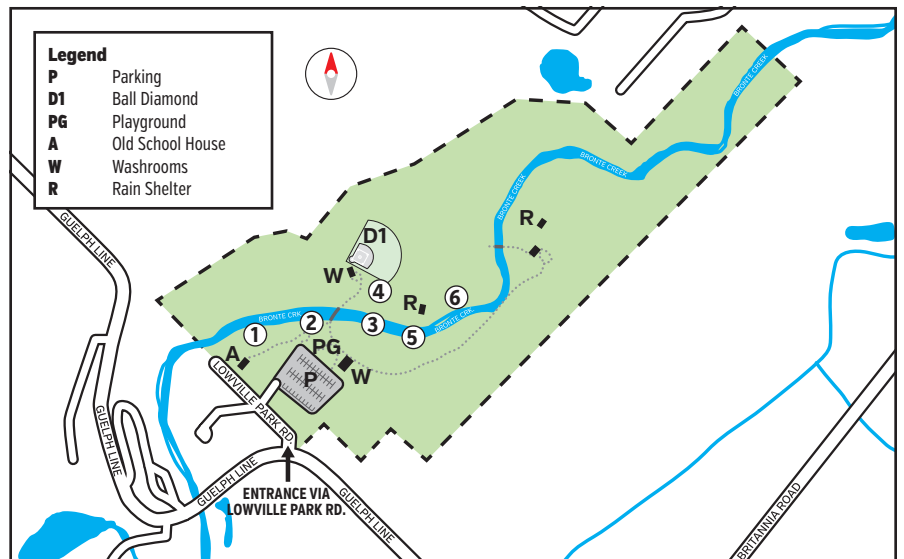
Located at 6207 Lowville Park Road in north Burlington. From Dundas Street take Guelph Line north 10 kilometers and turn onto Lowville Park Road for park entrance. Enjoy a stroll along Bronte Creek or follow the nature trails through the woods.

**Potable water is NOT available at this park location.**

## Picnic area use requirements

- Picnic site size: Number of people per site is determined by the size of the site not by the number of people that can be seated at picnic tables. The area between individual picnic sites is not included in your rental permit. Clients are encouraged to visit the site prior to their event date and to bring their own chairs.
- To keep the picnic sites and parks clean, use the trash bins provided. Please bring garbage bags to collect your waste, in case park bins are full.
- Bring your own hibachi or small portable barbeque. Dispose of the charcoal only in the hot ash bins.
- Do not put hibachis or barbeques on tables
- Dogs must be on a leash at all times. You must clean up after your dog.
- Halton Health Department must be notified if you are making or giving food to the public.
- Shade tents are permitted as long as they are not staked into the ground.
- Parking is limited, car pooling is encouraged. Parking services will enforce parking by-laws.
- There is no electricity onsite.

### **Not permitted:**

- Open fires and/or barbeque pits.
- Alcoholic beverages
- Amplified music, sound systems, megaphones
- Inflatable structures or equipment
- Generators
- Fireworks
- Food trucks
- Preparation or sale of food in parking lot
- Unauthorized vehicles outside the designated parking areas. Parking services will enforce parking by-laws.

Use of the park is subject to City of Burlington By-laws as amended and enforced as per City of Burlington policies.
