



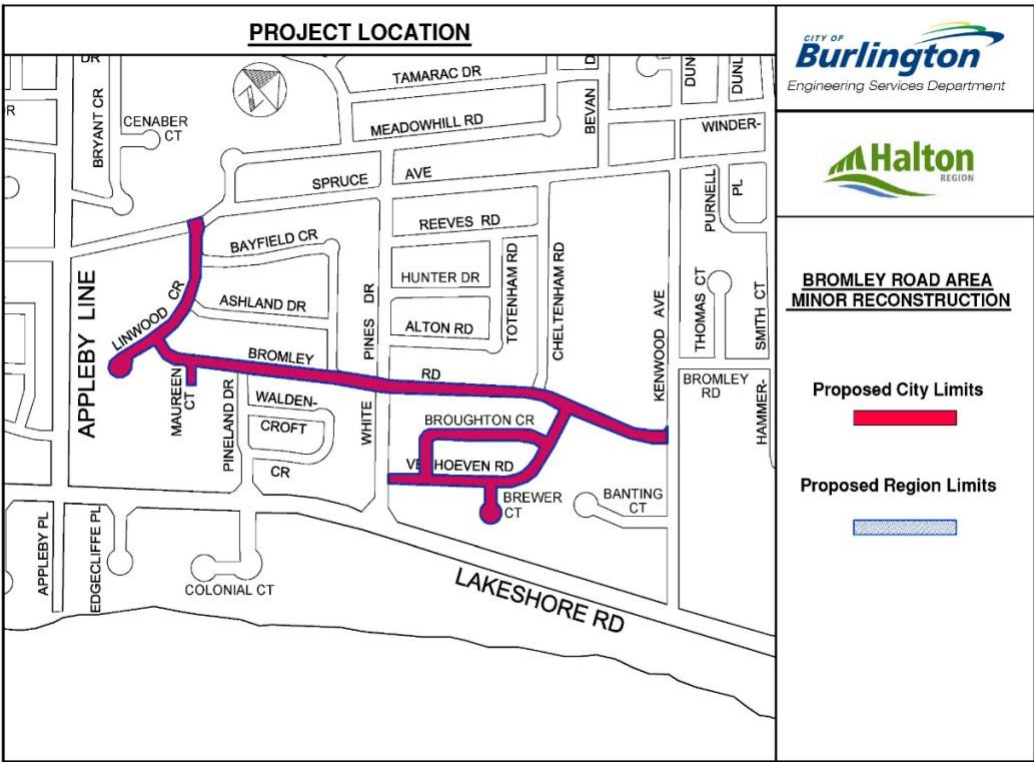

Bromley Road Area Minor Reconstruction Project

Project Update – April 2026

The continuation of the project works in the Bromley Rd. area are scheduled to begin in the next couple of weeks. The residents should expect to see the Contractor mobilizing in preparation for in-road works the week of April 6th, 2026. The project is currently scheduled to have all works completed, less top asphalt, by the end of 2026.

Driveways

For information regarding a driveway restoration credit being paid to residents for the funding of privately contracted restoration of the entire driveway in-lieu of the partial driveway restoration under the contract, i.e. up to the limit of disturbance due to construction only, please contact Hasan.Rabby@burlington.ca.

Parking

For the duration of construction, enforcement of the “5-hour” maximum on-street parking by-law will be relaxed when your driveway is inaccessible or closed. Residents are asked to register their vehicle online at www.burlington.ca/parking or call 905-335-7816 Monday to Friday 8:30 to 4:30 p.m.

Vehicles are not permitted to park where signs are posted. (e.g. No Parking, No Stopping, and Fire Route etc.) In addition, vehicles are not to block fire hydrants, driveway access or park their vehicles facing the wrong direction.

How does a parking exemption work?

- It allows a vehicle to park on the street beyond the five-hour limit or overnight between 1 a.m. and 6 a.m., up to 15 days per calendar year, per licence plate.
- The only two parking offences waived AFTER a vehicle is registered for a parking exemption are:
 1. Park exceeding five-hour limit
 2. Park between 1 a.m. and 6 a.m.
- All other parking offences apply as they are not part of the parking exemption program.

During City construction projects, the extra days will not be included in the 15-day-per-year limit when your driveway is not accessible. However, it is important to register your vehicle for this program so that you will not receive a parking ticket.
