



## Plains Road Protected Bikeway and Resurfacing Project Update No. 1 – April 19, 2022 [Burlington.ca/PlainsRoadResurfacing](http://Burlington.ca/PlainsRoadResurfacing)

The City of Burlington will be resurfacing and installing new bicycle facilities on Plains Road from Spring Gardens Road to Waterdown Road in 2022. The project team expects Council approval for the project on May 17, 2022 and award of the contract to Associated Paving & Materials Ltd., with construction work to begin on site on June 6<sup>th</sup>, 2022

The construction work includes:

- Resurfacing the roadway.
- Spot curb and sidewalk replacement.
- Spot roadway base repairs.
- Installation of cycle track on the north side of Plains Road
- Installation of protected bike lane on the south side of Plains Road
- Protected Intersections at Gorton Ave, Daryl Drive and Howard Road.
- Removal of overhead utility lines
- Streetlight relocations and improvements
- Streetlight crossing at Spring Gardens Road

### Construction Schedule

Construction activity is scheduled to commence the week of June 6<sup>th</sup>, 2022 with signage and tree protection being installed. Completion is scheduled for the end of November 2022, weather permitting.

## Night and Weekend Work

In order to complete the resurfacing of Plains Road, Associated Paving & Materials Ltd will be required to work at night and/or work on weekends. Working at night or on weekends will minimize disruptions to traffic as much as possible when completing concrete road base removals or work that spans across multiple lanes of traffic.

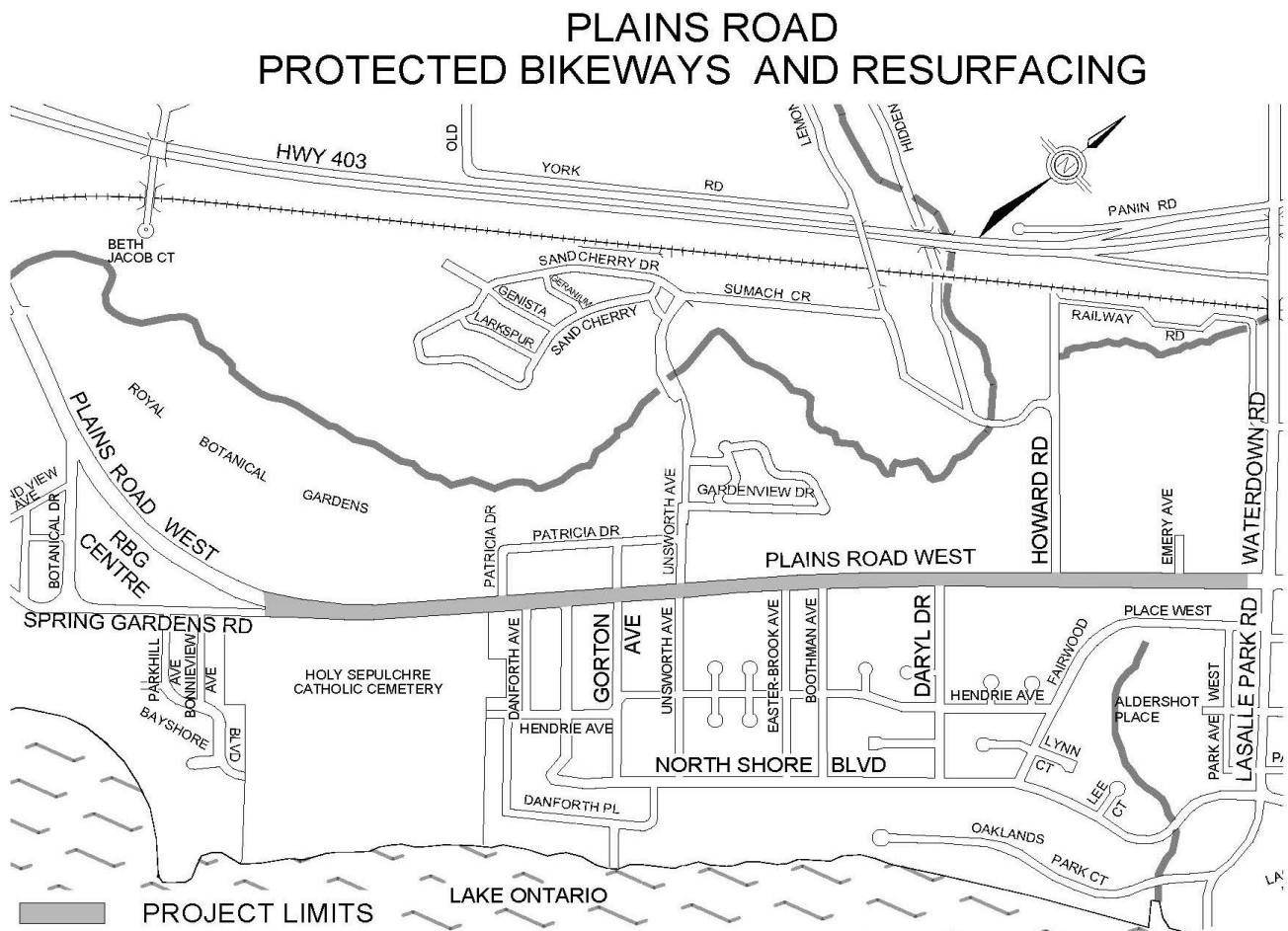
## Temporary Road Closures

There are no extended road closures scheduled on this project, although there will be local lane closures as required and restrictions in place to ensure flow of traffic at peak times.

## Access To Your Residence

Please note that during normal construction hours (Monday to Friday, 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.) vehicle access to and from your property may at times be difficult, additionally, driveways will be temporarily closed when work is being carried out in the immediate area and when pouring new curb and sidewalk.

## **Parking**

For the duration of construction when your driveway is inaccessible or closed, please park on neighbouring streets (Parking on Plains Road will not be permitted at any time for the duration of this project) where no construction is taking place and register your vehicle for the On-Street Parking Exemption Program at:

### **How does a parking exemption work?**

- It allows a vehicle to park on the street beyond the 5-hour limit or overnight between 1 a.m. to 6 a.m., up to 15 days per calendar year, per license plate.
- The only two parking offences waived AFTER a vehicle is registered for a parking exemption are:
  1. park exceeding 5-hour limit
  2. park between 1 a.m. to 6 a.m.
- All other parking offences apply as they are not part of the parking exemption program.

### **During city construction projects.**

The extra days will not be included in the 15-day per year limit when your driveway is not accessible. However, it is important to register your vehicle for this program so that you will not receive a parking ticket.

## **Driveway Regrading and Restoration**

The City will be regrading driveway aprons to accommodate the new cycle track between the curb and sidewalk as well as improving the access to resident driveways. In order to improve the driveway grades, the City will be regrading driveways behind the sidewalk to accommodate the aprons and sidewalk being lowered. The City will be restoring driveways to the extent necessary to complete the regrading works for the full width of the driveway as well as repairing any damage caused by our construction work.

## **Your front lawn**

As part of this project, some curb and gutter and sidewalk will be replaced. Additionally, the City will be changing the grade of the aprons between the curb and sidewalk to accommodate the new cycle track and increase the ease of access to your driveway. This will involve some re-grading of your lawn near the roadway and behind the sidewalk to accommodate the work. All disturbances to your lawn, walkways and driveways will be restored.

## **Lawn Irrigation System**

If you have a lawn irrigation system where curb and sidewalk are to be replaced, we recommend you disconnect and remove any sprinkler heads within the City's road allowance. Please flag all other irrigation heads, so they are not damaged. The City is not responsible for damaged heads within the road allowance. This does not have to be done until work in your area is scheduled.

### **Tree Removals**

To accommodate this project, tree removals will be required. Some pruning of hazardous trees and limbs will also be completed.

### **Vibration**

You may at times experience some minor vibration as a result of construction equipment. We recommend that you remove small light objects from shelving around the house.

### **Mail Delivery**

There is a chance mail delivery may be affected by the construction project. Canada Post has been notified of this project.

### **Garbage Pick up**

Please continue to put your garbage and recycling out on the usual day. It is the contractor's responsibility to move your garbage to a location that can be accessed by the garbage truck and return your garbage containers. In order to help the contractor we would ask that you indicate on your garbage cans and recycle bins your house numbers.
