Street Improvements in the Holt Drive Area

Project Update – May 2018

The City of Burlington and Region of Halton have awarded the above-mentioned project to Coco Paving Inc.

Construction activity is scheduled to commence the week of June 4, 2018 with signage and tree protection being installed. The tentative construction timeline is from the week of June 4, 2018 until the end of October 2018. The construction includes:

Holt Drive, west of Vanderburgh Dr. Gayne Boulevard., south portion at Holt Dr.

- Full depth asphalt replacement
- Curb and gutter replacement
- New curb installation
- Storm Sewer replacement

Holt Drive, east of Vanderburgh Dr. Cherrywood Drive

- Full depth asphalt replacement
- Localized sidewalk replacement
- Localized curb and gutter replacement
- Watermain and service replacement
- Storm sewer repairs

Gayne Boulevard, north section

- Asphalt Replacement

The watermain will be installed, followed by water services and road works.

Road Works

It is expected that the roadways will be in a gravel state for an extended period of time at which point, the contractor will suppress any dust and/or nuisance caused by the granular with a dust-controlling agent.

Parking

For the duration of construction when your driveway is inaccessible or closed, please park on neighbouring streets, or streets where no construction is taking place and register your vehicle for the On-Street Parking Exemption Program at:

- www.burlington.ca/exemption
- 905-335-7844 - 24-hour voice message.

How does a parking exemption work?

- It allows a vehicle to park on the street beyond the 5-hour limit or overnight between 1 a.m. to 6 a.m., up to 15 days per calendar year, per license plate.
- The only two parking offences waived AFTER a vehicle is registered for a parking exemption are:
 1. park exceeding 5-hour limit
 2. park between 1 a.m. to 6 a.m.
- All other parking offences apply as they are not part of the parking exemption program.

During City construction projects.

- The extra days will not be included in the 15-day per year limit when your driveway is not accessible.
- However, it is important to register your vehicle for this program so that you will not receive a parking ticket.

Watermain Construction

There may be some brief disruptions to water services at various times throughout the course of the project. You will receive written notice of any scheduled shutdowns or disruptions a minimum of 48 hours before the disruption occurs. Disruptions are typically short in duration with water service being restored within 1 hour.

Your front lawn & driveway

As part of this project, curb and gutter will be replaced. Additionally, some re-grading of your boulevard lawn near the roadway will be required as a result of the work. All disturbances to your lawn, walkways and driveways will be restored.

Lawn Irrigation System

If you have a lawn irrigation system within the City's road allowance, please disconnect and remove any sprinkler heads within the City's road allowance. Please flag all other irrigation heads, so they are not damaged. The City or Region are not responsible for damaged heads within the road allowance.

Vibration

You may at times experience some minor vibration as a result of construction equipment.

Garbage Pick up

Please continue to put your garbage and recycling out on the usual day. It is the contractor's responsibility to move your garbage to a location that can be accessed by the garbage truck and return your garbage containers. In order to help the contractor we would ask that you indicate on your garbage cans and recycle bins your house numbers.

Temporary Road Closures

There are no extended road closures scheduled on this project, although through traffic will be interrupted during the normal construction day. There will be times where roads will be temporarily closed as traffic will be unable to traverse past the construction equipment and trucks.
