

Notice of Public Information Centre

The City of Burlington and Region of Halton are conducting a Class Environmental Assessment (Class EA) study on the reconstruction of the Appleby Line and Harvester Road intersection. The study will address the impacts of current and the expected increase in traffic on the operation of the intersection and surrounding road network. The study area covers a distance of about 1.2 km along Harvester Road from Zelco Drive to Century Drive and approximately 300 m north and south of the intersection on Appleby Line.

This study is being conducted as a “Schedule C” project, following Phases 1 through 4 of the Municipal Engineers Association “Municipal Class Environmental Assessment” (October 2000, as amended in 2007 and 2011). A problem statement and a number of alternative solutions were presented for public review and comment at the first Public Information Centre

(PIC) held for this study in November, 2013. Following a review of public comments, a combined solution was selected:

- Widen Harvester Road within the study limits from 4 to 5 lanes to accommodate a continuous centre left-turning lane;
- Add additional left turn lanes at the Appleby Line / Harvester Road intersection;
- Add bicycle lanes to the two roads under consideration;
- Complete any missing sections of sidewalk; and
- Maintain and over time improve transit as well as promote carpooling/ride share programs.

Consultation with the public is a key component of this study. A second PIC will be held for the public and stakeholders (land owners and regulatory agencies) to review alternative design concepts for the preferred solution. The PIC will be held:
