



Free parking is available in Downtown Burlington.

On-street (three-hour maximum):

- 6 p.m. – 1 a.m., Monday to Friday
- Saturdays and Sundays
- Holidays
- During the month of December

Note: Overnight parking is not allowed between 1 a.m. – 6 a.m.

In municipal parking lots and garage (no time limit):

- 6 p.m. – 9 a.m., Monday to Friday
- Saturdays and Sundays
- Holidays
- During the month of December

Free parking is also available for the maximum time allowed with a valid:

- Accessible parking permit
- City-issued veteran permit



Keep Burlington's roads safe and leave your car overnight.

Downtown Municipal lots only

Cars are permitted to park overnight in municipal parking lots during the winter months. Please be aware that during a snowfall, municipal parking lots will be cleared of snow and cars may be at risk of getting plowed in.

On the Street

Daytime and evenings: On-street parking is allowed for a maximum of 5 hours.

Overnight: On-street parking is not allowed between 1 a.m. and 6 a.m., unless otherwise indicated by signage.

Parking exemptions: In special circumstances (e.g. driveway repairs or out-of-town guests), residents and visitors may request a parking exemption.

A parking exemption allows a vehicle or RV to park on the street beyond the 5 hour limit or overnight between 1 a.m. to 6 a.m., up to 15 days per calendar year, per licence plate.

Residential On-Street Parking Permits

Starting Sept. 1, 2016, pay parking permits will be available for streets in the Alton community. A limit of one permit per household will be issued and the cost for the permit will be \$30 per month or \$350 per year.

The pay permit will allow vehicles to park on the street 24 hours a day, not to exceed 48 hours on the same street. All other parking offences are applicable.

Near a School

Help keep school zones safe for children. Vehicles picking up children from school are not permitted to park and wait in a “no parking zone.”

*Municipal Parking Lots

Vehicles are permitted to park overnight in parking lots at Orchard Community Park, Lampman Park and others if applicable.

Parking in Winter

Vehicles parked on the street during a snow storm or before snow removal is complete will be subject to enforcement (e.g. \$120 parking ticket and/or tow).



Neighbourhood On-street Parking Program (NOSPP) Streets

In designated areas of the city, vehicles are permitted to park on residential streets overnight between 1 a.m. and 6 a.m., seven days a week without a parking permit. These areas are part of the NOSPP.

Winter Parking on NOSPP streets: The NOSPP parking designation is not in effect during a snow storm or before snow removal is complete. Vehicles will be subject to enforcement (e.g. \$120 parking ticket and/or tow).
