

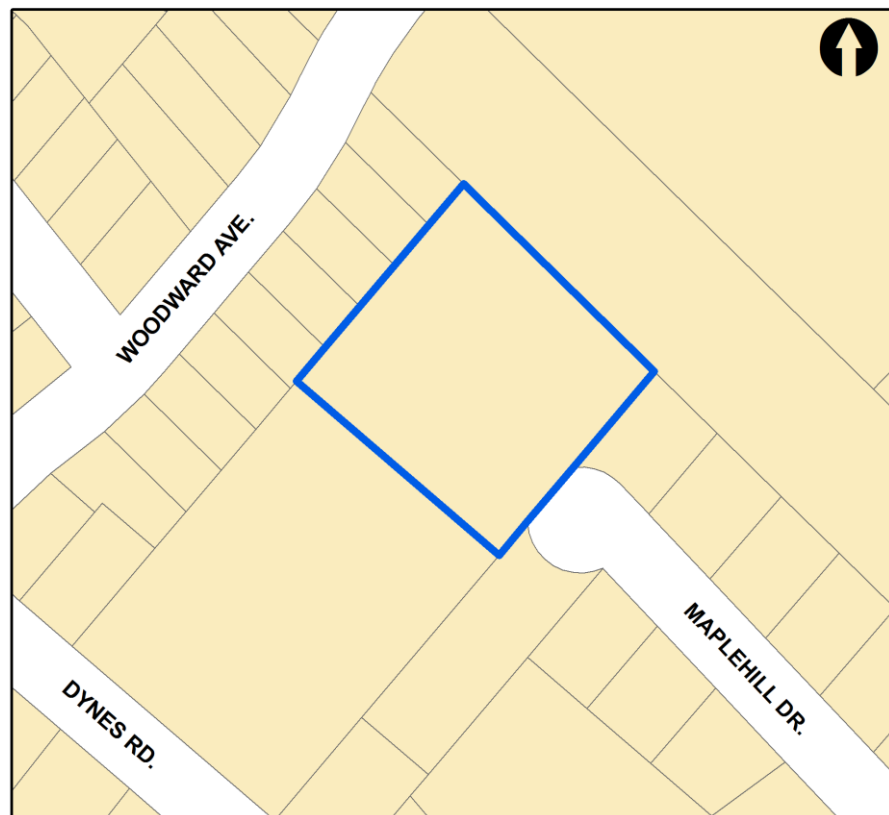
**Planning Application for: 600 Maplehill Drive (File: 510-01/20)**

The City of Burlington has received an application from T. Johns Consulting Group on behalf of 2531820 Ontario Inc. to subdivide the lands known as 600 Maplehill Drive.

The purpose of these applications is to subdivide the lands in order to create four townhouse blocks and a block for private condominium roads. The proposal would facilitate the future development of 20 townhouse units fronting onto private condominium roads, as per the Official Plan and Zoning By-law Amendments approved by the Local Planning Appeal Tribunal (File Nos. . The property is currently zoned “Medium Density Residential with a site specific exception (RM2-478)” and is designated “Residential – Medium Density”.

Staff will be presenting the proposal to the City’s Community Planning, Regulation and Mobility Committee of Council.

## **Speaking at the Meeting:**

Since this is a statutory public meeting, you do not have to register in advance in order to speak; however, if you do wish to arrange in advance to speak, please complete the online delegation registration form at [www.burlington.ca/delegate](http://www.burlington.ca/delegate) or submit a written request by email to the Clerks Department at [clerks@burlington.ca](mailto:clerks@burlington.ca) by noon the day before the meeting is to be held. All requests to delegate must contain a copy of your intended remarks which will be circulated to all members of committee in advance as a backup should any technology issues occur. Speakers are limited to a maximum of 10 minutes each and are webcasted online.

In addition, a tickertape with registration information will be visible on the webcast which provides details on how submit a request.

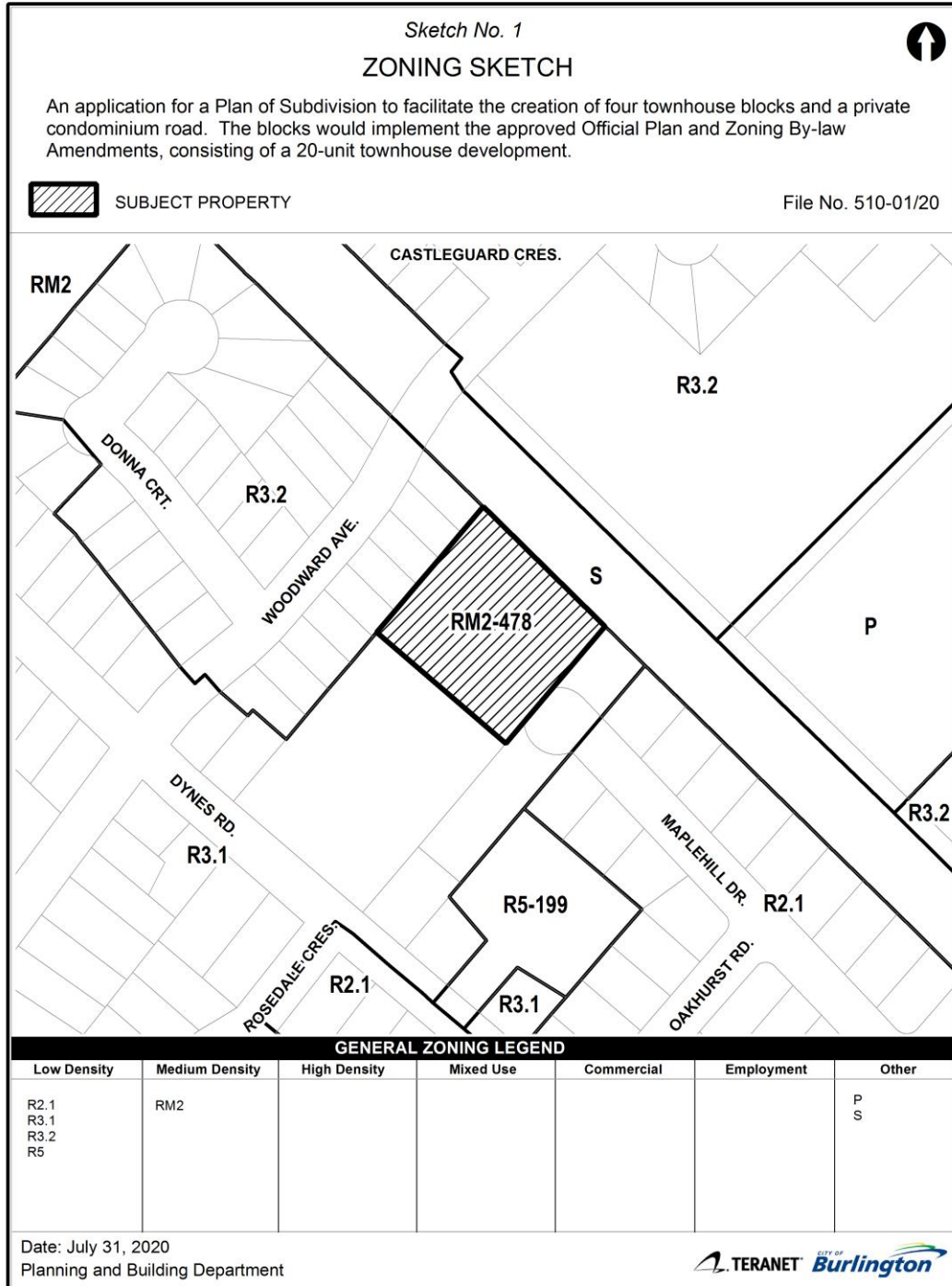

If a person or public body does not make oral submissions at a public meeting, or make written submissions to the City of Burlington before the proposed official plan amendment is adopted, and/or the zoning by-law is passed, the person or public body may not be added as a party to the hearing of an appeal before the Local Planning Appeal Tribunal unless, in the opinion of the Tribunal, there are reasonable grounds to do so.



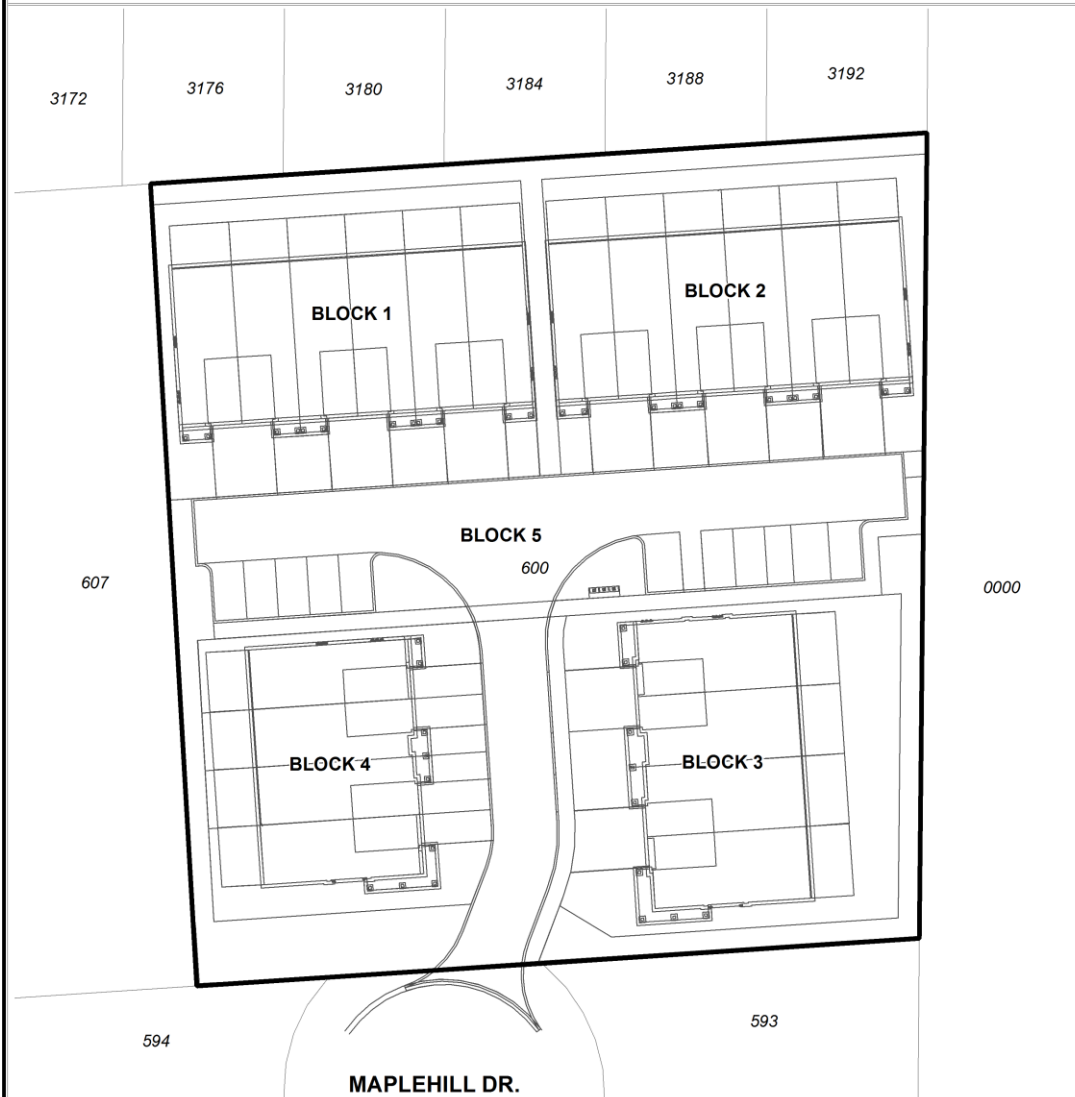
