To address climate change impacts. Some items include:

- \$962K for 4 new buses, 8 drivers, 1 new Handi-Van and driver
- \$42K for free transit for children age 12 and under
- \$100K for new electric vehicle charging stations at City facilities
- \$60K for new private tree bylaw program
- \$300K to update the Urban Forestry Management Plan and a new tree planting initiative
- \$224 for Climate AdaptationPlan.
