- Amy Schnurr, representing BurlingtonGreen, spoke in opposition to this recommendation and asked Council to direct staff to report back with alternative locations for this maintenance facility.

**National Access Awareness Week Proclamation and report providing information
on Corporate Occupational Health and Safety
Related to Item HR-2-13**

- Anne and Dave Marsden, Community Health & Safety Advocates, commented on the importance of National Access Awareness Week and expressed disappointment with the Public Works Week poster which did not represent the broader community, including people with disabilities. **Marsden requested Council to take another look at the Health and Safety report and rather than receive for information, discuss at the May 21, 2013 Council meeting whether enough attention is being given to such reports.** In addition, Marsden requested that the Fire Plan for City Hall be reviewed immediately in order to identify where those with disabilities are in the building so they can be brought to safety when the fire alarm is activated.

**Report concerning the Burlington Executive Airport
Related to Item E-25-13**

- Vanessa Warren, representing Rural Burlington Greenbelt Coalition (RBGC), requested the following: an immediate end to the illegal dumping at the airport; full enforcement of site alternation by-laws; upgrade and improvement to the fill by-law; testing of the already-imported fill; remediation of non-compliant filled areas on the airport and neighbouring properties; and by-law compliance for any new airport works.
- Ken Woodruff representing BurlingtonGreen, requested that the current Order to Comply process continue to be pursued to ensure that By-law 6-2003 or a new fill by-law be enforced if and when the airport acquires additional lands. In addition, Woodruff asked that the city restrain any more fill operations at the airport under the Ontario Municipal Act, Section 440.

Council Reconsideration of staff direction on the 2012 Festivals and Events Annual Report and Proposed 2013-2014 Festival and Events Program concerning the Chilly Half Marathon Related to Item PR-37-12

- Diane Leblovic, 125 Birett Drive, Burlington, spoke in opposition to the reconsideration and expressed disappointment that she was not advised of this coming forward. Leblovic commented on the importance of proceeding with the public consultation and noted that there are other routes that could be used for this race so different areas of Burlington can be showcased.
- John Amor, Burlington resident, spoke in opposition to the reconsideration and asked that proper consultation take place so that different routes and/or times can be determined. Amor stated that residents are willing to be inconvenienced every two to three years, but not every year and added that all of Burlington should be shown off.

APPROVAL OF EXEMPTIONS TO MUNICIPAL PARKING FEES FOR VETERANS

The following amendment was moved by Councillor Meed Ward and seconded by Councillor Taylor:

Amend Item TS-08-13 of the Development & Infrastructure Committee Meeting No. 6-13 of May 6, 2013, by adding the following paragraph:

“Direct the Director of Transit to exempt any veteran with appropriate identification from transit fares annually on the first Sunday in May (Battle of the Atlantic), June 6, the Sunday in August closest to August 19 (anniversary of the raid on Dieppe), September 17 and November 11 based on the same eligibility criteria as outlined for parking exemption in the above paragraph.”

AMENDMENT CARRIED

Direct the Director of Transportation Services to prepare a draft amendment to Parking By-law 87-2007 to exempt any vehicle lawfully displaying an Ontario Veteran vehicle license plate from the standard parking fees at all municipally operated parking spaces annually on: the first Sunday in May, June 6, the Sunday closest to August 19, September 17 and November 11; and

Direct the Director of Transportation Services to prepare a draft amendment to parking By-law 87-2007 to broaden the eligibility criteria for the City of Burlington Veteran parking exemptions permit to include any person who:

1. Served in the Canadian Forces including Reserve Forces, the forces of the Commonwealth, its allies, the Merchant Navy or Ferry Command, during wartime;
2. Is serving or has served in NATO operations or as a member of the United Nations Peacekeeping Force; or
3. Served in the Vietnam War in the forces of the United States or its allies during this war and who was a Canadian citizen at the time of such service;
and

Direct the Director of Transit to exempt any veteran with appropriate identification from transit fares annually on the first Sunday in May (Battle of the Atlantic), June 6, the Sunday in August closest to August 19 (anniversary of the raid on Dieppe), September 17 and November 11 based on the same eligibility criteria as outlined for parking exemption in the above paragraph. (TS-08-13)

APPROVAL TO REMOVE TREES FOR THE PROPOSED CITY VIEW PARK MAINTENANCE FACILITY

Approve the removal of sixty (60) city owned trees from the proposed site of the City View Park maintenance facility; and

Instruct the City Clerk to prepare the necessary by-law adopting Official Plan Amendment No. 91 as contained in Appendix I of planning and building department report PB-33-13-1; and

Approve the application by Mattwood Construction Ltd., P.O. Box 91522 RPO, Roseland Plaza, Burlington, ON, L7R 4L6, to rezone the lands at 513 Pearl Street from DRL to DRL-442 to permit a proposed semi-detached dwelling; and

Instruct planning and building department staff to prepare the by-law to amend Zoning By-law 2020, as amended, rezoning the lands at 513 Pearl from DRL to DRL-442, implementing the draft zoning by-law contained in Appendix II of planning and building department report PB-33-13-1, upon completion by the applicant of the following:

1. Execution of a Residential Development Agreement including the conditions listed in Appendix III of planning and building department report PB-33-13-1;
2. Payment of variable rezoning fees, on a per unit basis, in accordance with By-law 127-2006, as amended; and

Deem that the amending zoning by-law will conform to the Official Plan for the City of Burlington once Official Plan Amendment No. 91 is adopted; and

State that the amending zoning by-law will not come into effect until Official Plan Amendment No. 91 is adopted. (PB-33-13-1)

APPROVAL OF RESOLUTION TO METROLINX

WHEREAS gridlock and traffic congestion costs the GTHA and the Province of Ontario \$6 billion per year in lost output and impact on commuters; and

WHEREAS Metrolinx was established by the Government of Ontario to improve the coordination and integration of all modes of transportation in the Greater Toronto and Hamilton Area (GTHA); and

WHEREAS in 2008 Metrolinx launched the Big Move, a 25 year, \$50 billion plan for integrated transportation and transit in the GTHA; and

WHEREAS more than \$16 billion has been committed in investment in regional transit projects and work is currently underway; and

WHEREAS on November 29, 2012 Metrolinx announced the “next wave” of new regional and local transportation projects, requiring a total investment of \$34 billion, and reiterated a \$2 billion annual revenue target to fund related costs; and

WHEREAS on April 13, 2013 Metrolinx released its short list of 11 proposed investment tools and is now engaging with municipalities, stakeholders and the public on these tools in order to inform the Investment Strategy report; and

WHEREAS on or before June 1, 2013 Metrolinx must provide the Minister of Transportation and the heads of the councils of the municipalities in the regional transportation area with a copy of the Corporation’s Investment Strategy, including proposals for revenue generating tools that may be used by the province or the municipalities to support the implementation of the transportation plan; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT Council indicates its support for regional transportation in the GTHA, which is necessary for the growth, economic and social health, of the City, GTHA region and Province of Ontario; and

FURTHER THAT the Federal Government earmark federal infrastructure funding to support the implementation of the Big Move Transportation Plan; and

FURTHER THAT a national transportation strategy is required of the Federal Government to address the critical aspects of goods and people movements in this country and a provincial economic strategy is required of the Provincial Government to relocate and disperse economic activity and employment growth throughout Southern Ontario; and

FURTHER THAT the Provincial Government mandate Metrolinx to create a regional transit authority for all of the GTHA; and

FURTHER THAT A gateway for the Province of Ontario is necessary to link air, ship, rail, and road as an essential component of provincial economic infrastructure strategy to successfully compete in the global economy and to provide a positive contribution to the Canadian economy, similar to the gateways in Vancouver, Winnipeg, Halifax, and Moncton; and

FURTHER THAT the concept for Free Trade Zones be considered for implementation in the Province of Ontario to facilitate a strategy of advanced manufacturing associated with the objective of dispersing economic activity and employment within the GTHA and the economic growth and employment strategy be initiated as soon as possible; and

FURTHER THAT Council indicates to Metrolinx that it supports the use of the following GTHA revenue tools:

- Development Charges
- Fuel Tax
- Highway Tolls
- Transit Fare Increase
- Parking Space Levy; and

FURTHER THAT Council indicates to Metrolinx that it does not support the use of the following GTHA revenue tools:

- Property Tax
- High Occupancy Tolls (HOT)
- Sales Tax
- Employer Payroll Tax
- Land Value Capture
- Vehicle Kilometre Travelled (VKT); and

FURTHER THAT this resolution be forwarded to Metrolinx, the Provincial Ministries of Finance, Transportation, and Municipal Affairs & Housing, and the Federal Ministry of Transport, Infrastructure and Communities, the Region of Halton, the Town of Oakville, the Town of Milton and the Town of Halton Hills.
