SUBJECT: Burlington Executive Airport Update #11 – March 24, 2014

Discussion:

The following is a summary of the issues that have been addressed or are in the process of being addressed since the last update to Council, on February 24, 2014.

Site Alteration By-law Update

First draft discussions have been taking place with several parties over the past month. These parties include:

- Burlington Building Complete Communities Committee
- Burlington Sustainable Development - Policy & Development Subcommittee
- Area Engineering Directors' Committee
- Conservation Halton and the Niagara Escarpment Commission.
- Halton Region, Town of Oakville, Town of Halton Hills, Town of Milton
- Burlington Ward 3 & 6 Agriculture Committee
- Ministry of Environment
- Environmental consultant

The Town of Oakville, Town of Halton Hills and Town of Milton are all in the process of revising their Site Alteration By-laws and have expressed interest in coordinating all of the by-laws to provide a level of consistency and cooperation for the future.

The level of interest from all parties has been very high and discussions have been extensive. Comments on the first draft are in the process of being received.

A second draft will be developed to initiate the next round of consultations with the agencies, municipalities, stakeholders and the public.

Given the level of interest and response, as well as the proposed coordination with our adjacent municipalities, we anticipate a final version can be developed and presented to Committee and Council in the late Spring 2014.

Other Regulators:

Update on FOI Request to MOE for Monitoring Plan and Details

Staff have received correspondence from the Office of the Information and Privacy Commissioner of Ontario (IPC) indicating that the City's appeal to the Ministry of Environment's FOI decision has been received. The IPC has indicated that mediation will be the first step. Staff will continue to work with the IPC through the mediation process. Mediation will require cooperation from the MOE and potentially the Airpark owner. Staff will report back to Committee in the next update.

Legal Matters:

The hearing of the Burlington Airpark appeal of the decision of the Superior Court of Justice has been scheduled by the Court of Appeal. The appeal will be heard on June 11, 2014 at 10:30am at the Court of Appeal in Toronto.


Communication Matters:
